AFTER ACTION REPORT CALL TO HONOR #4 Alabama National Cemetery Montevallo, Alabama Tuesday, April 12, 2022 10:15 am

The unclaimed remains for this service were located at the Elmwood Memorial Cemetery in Birmingham, AL.

For this service MIAP-AL interred one spouse, Marian Evelyn Dewalt. She was born in Ohio on September 9, 1896. In 1928, Marian married Philip Dewalt Riblet. Mr. Philip Dewalt Riblet was a World War I Veteran. He served in the US Army from August 27, 1917 to October 27, 1919. He flew aerial photography missions in World War I and was honorably discharged as a First Lieutenant. Mr. Riblet died in 1949. Marian Riblet died March 5, 1959.

The service was on cool spring day. There were approximately 40 people in attendance. They represented the Support Committee of the Alabama National Cemetery, one VFW Post, two American legion Posts and Birmingham Military Officers Association of America.
